As Language Specialists we will...firstly become poets by writing poems inspired by Spring. Then, we will be using a range of engaging texts to inspire our spoken language, reading and writing learning. Initially this will be Meerkat Mail by Emily Gravett. Using this text, we will be following the journey of Sunny the meerkat using our inference skills by becoming reading detectives before writing letters and postcards from different countries across the world. Discrete spelling, handwriting and reading sessions tailored to your child's stage of development will also continue. Age related grammatical concepts will be embedded throughout. In the Summer Term this will be the use of tenses, fronted adverbials, paragraphing and using a range of punctuation. A key focus will be on teaching the children how to edit their writing independently. We will also be applying our reading and writing skills across the curriculum by researching geographical concepts and writing persuasive letters about deforestation.

As Geographers we will... use one of our key texts Meerkat Mail to begin thinking geographically about different biomes and climates. We will explore rainforests around the world. Learning what they are, where they are, what they contain and who lives there! The children will learn about hemispheres, longitude and latitude as well using maps and fieldwork skills during our visit to the zoo. We will then learn about deforestation and the impact it is having on our world.

<u>Trips and Events</u> – The Summer Term provides many opportunities for getting out and about. Our first trip, this half term, will be to Coronation Park which is now open again! At the park, we will be using our science enquiry skills to investigate forces. We will later visit the zoo, where we will take part in a classroom session based on rainforests and visit the meerkats to learn more about the characters of our class text. Of course, we also have the very exciting Year 3 Camp Bosdet residential. If you have not already, please ensure your consent form has been returned.

Summer Term 2024 Year 3

<u>As Mathematicians we will be...</u> continuing to follow the 'Maths No Problem' scheme. We will be using concrete maths resources and pictorial representations to support learning new concepts and will also focus on using and understanding a range of different mathematical vocabulary to explain our reasoning. Using money, understanding fractions and telling the time will be the main focus for the term before studying shape, perimeter and angles.

The children will continue to have a times tables test every 2 weeks which has proven very successful with all the children improving their scores greatly – thank you for your continued support with this.







<u>As Scientists we will...</u> firstly be completing our 'Forces and Magnets' unit of work which the children are very excited about! We will then be having a focus science week this half term on the topic 'Plants' where we will be investigating the functions of the different parts of plants, seed dispersal and what they need to grow. Next half term, we will be exploring the topic of Light; investigating light reflection and

Across the curriculum

PE – PE days will continue to be on a <u>Wednesday and Friday</u>. This term, we are delighted to be taking part in the BNP Tennis Programme where we will be visited by coaches from the Caesarean Tennis club who will teach us the fundamentals of tennis. The coaches will be on the lookout for children to select for the BNP finals competition in June! Year 3 will also be introduced to netball this term, developing their awareness of positions and rules.
