

Year 1 Spring Term- Houses and Homes

Key Questions: Where do we live now? Where did people live in the past?

Through these themes we will learn about the following children's rights:

Article 7: The right to a name and to belong to a county

Article 15: The right to meet with friends and join groups.

As Physical Educationalists we will:

Be learning to teamwork whilst playing invasion games
Develop our throwing accuracy and catching.
Develop performing shapes in gymnastics, combining travelling movements and rolls.

As Artists we will we will:

Explore the work of Peter Knight.
Create cityscapes
Learn to bake bread and design and create a fruit smoothy.

As Historians we will be finding out about houses in the Great Fire of London.

We will develop our historical investigation skills by asking the following questions:

When was the 17th century and what was life like then?
What happened during the great fire?
Why did the fire spread so quickly?
What happened after the great fire?
Why did the great fire happen?

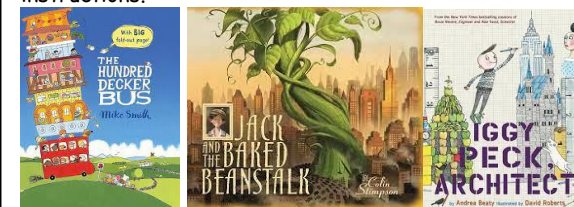
As Geographers we will be finding out about our local area.

We will develop our mapping and fieldwork skills by asking the following questions:

Are Jersey and London similar or different?

As Language Specialists we will be using the following texts to develop our ability to:

Write in full sentences using our phonic sounds to write words.
Write common exceptions words such as 'the' and 'your'.
Use punctuation including full stops exclamation marks and question marks.
Form letters in the pre cursive style.
Use a range of adjectives to describe nouns.
Use conjunctions 'and' because' and 'but' to join to parts of a sentence.
Write in a range of genres including: adverts, stories, recounts and instructions.
